This meeting is the second in a series of public informational meetings that are being held in conjunction with the preparation of a plan for Fitchburg's Northeast Neighborhood. This neighborhood was identified as a Future Urban Development Area in previous planning efforts undertaken by the City. The first public informational meeting was held on February 23, 2006; it explored the background for this planning effort and sought public input regarding a broad range of issues.

This meeting will focus on a specific set of technical issues: storm water management, sanitary sewer service, public water supply, multi-modal transportation, parks and other open spaces. The meeting will be organized into segments, with each segment including a brief presentation on a particular topic followed by an opportunity to ask questions directly related to the topic.
